Shiny Side Up

Hi, everyone, sorry for the delay in writing this article. I broke my wrist whilst doing some Super Motard training



during a recent trip to Cairns. It'll be another 8 weeks before I can ride. I must thank Stay Upright's Cairns instructor and resident Super Motard racer, Justin Schuberg for his expertise, bike and time. Despite the little mistake, I gained valuable insight into and tuition on that style of riding.

I'd also like to ask you to join me in wishing a speedy recovery to Max Thompson, National Training Manager for Stay Upright Rider Training. Max is a dear friend of mine, and a mentor and is currently in hospital after a nasty crash. Many riders can thank Max for his involvement in their pathway to riding at all levels. Max is a valuable key contributor to Q-Ride and Victoria's new Motorcycle Graduated Licensing System (M-GLS). His knowledge on all things training related and riding related is vast, and he is also a highly skilled rider. Max suffered a crash recently whilst participating in a Historic Race meet at Stanthorpe. The cause of the crash has not yet been identified through any official investigations, only some speculation as to what may have caused the crash. Max has quite significant injuries which has kept him in the intensive care unit at the P.A Hospital. The Doctors and critical care team there are

excellent and are doing a fantastic job looking after my friend. There is good news that he is progressing in the right direction, but what lays ahead is a long period of recovery. All of us at Stay Upright were quite worried for him when he first arrived at the P.A so I am very thankful to hear of his progress.

So, I guess this is a timely reminder that we are not super-human or immune from receiving a visit from lady luck's evil twin. I still ride on the road with a mindset that crashing is not an option, taking steps to manage my risks. To manage the injury risks I will always choose to wear the appropriate riding gear, and I choose to wear leathers as my first option too. I was even mocked once by a senior police motorcyclist for wearing leathers, but I stand by my choice to wear the right gear all the time. Why do I wear it? Well, I think the question is why not? What are the reasons not to wear gear? Is it too hot? Is it too expensive?

A point I have made to riders at training is that wearing gear reflects your attitude as a rider. As an instructor I cannot teach attitude, but I certainly hope to influence it so I wear appropriate gear whenever I ride. Proper gear gives protection from two broad types of injury. Impact injuries and abrasion injuries from sliding across the road surface. No gear will protect you from fatal injuries received during a high-speed impact as motorcyclists don't have the same crash protection that is currently built into modern cars that makes those impacts survivable. But if you have a survivable crash whilst wearing gear you are going to survive it with less severe injuries and reduced rehabilitation time. This means you may be able to continue to work, hold your kids and partner, even pat your dog while recovering.

I had a minor oops once teaching on a course. These things can sometimes happen to the best of us. I own my error. It was relatively slow in speed but I still impacted onto the ground. Because I was wearing leathers with armour, the only bruising suffered was to my ego. I was able to continue the course. Had I not been wearing appropriate gear, there would have been injuries that would have needed medical treatment. That would have meant not being able to work and several other inconveniences that would have flowed on from that.

Something also to consider is the type and style of helmet you choose to wear. I have seen many cases where a rider has had a very minor fall that resulted in no injury, but the jaw area and visor of their full faced helmet was badly scratched from the impact onto the ground. Then I have a little shiver thinking that that minor fall would have been so much worse if they were wearing an open face helmet.

When purchasing new gear, take the time to ensure you get it correctly sized. It cannot be too big. Take some time wearing it in the shop. Especially when buying leathers. I have made this mistake before and did it again recently by being a little rushed and bought some nice gear but too big in size.

Riding safely on the road is a continuous process of evaluating risks, seeing the options and making good choices to manage those risks. As a rider, if you choose to not wear gear, I challenge you to think why. There are many places where gear is available. Whatever your budget, the purchase of gear must be factored into the purchase and ownership of a motorcycle.

If you don't wear gear because you feel the QLD climate can be quite hot at times, I'll conclude with saying "sweat wipes off - gravel rash doesn't."

Last Saturday is a long ride


