### **Shiny Side Up**



For this month's article, I want to write about some observations I have had regarding my

fellow riders and some of the choices they're making. We love to complain about and blame car drivers for not seeing us. Yet the choices I and some of my fellow riding instructors see some motorcyclists make during our daily commute is quite appalling. Many riders make decisions that indicate they have given little thought to how safe their riding is, let alone showing any level of courtesy to the other road users, including other motorcyclists. Recently I had a rider, on his large cruiser, cut up the inside of me on a tight right hand bend that formed the exit from a freeway. Now being a track day rider, I would expect that pass on a race track because there are overtaking rules that permit that. But in heavy traffic and public roads in general, this is not the place for such a pass. After all the effort and illegal lane splitting this rider did, he didn't arrive at his destination any quicker as I pulled into the car park only a couple of seconds behind him.

Filtering. It is legal but it isn't carte blanche to do whatever you want and ride as fast as you want through slow traffic. Think about the passing move described above and imagine if the rider did that to someone driving a car, they might not appreciate the move and form a less than favourable opinion on all motorcyclists. Now reverse the situation where a car driver decides they can use the road shoulder to squeeze past the slow motorcyclist in front, would you appreciate the move they made? My prediction is if we as a community of riders don't calm ourselves down and filter legally and safely, the laws will be repealed. There is a current increase in rider deaths and crashes. Remember insurance and car lobby groups are bigger than motorcycle groups. I read a statement made by a rider who claimed 99% of crashes are caused by the other driver. Well, that is not entirely true. The biggest crash risk for a rider is loss of control. That is the rider's error. Another of the other main crash types is rider crashing into the rear of slowing or stopped traffic. That too is rider error. So a lot of the time it is our own fault why we crash.

When it comes to filtering, the main error I see riders make is illegal edge filtering, and below is an extract from the traffic regulations. It clearly says edge filtering is illegal unless you're in a 90km/h or higher speed zone and your speed does not exceed 30km/h. Many riders do not appreciate that they are moving too quickly through the traffic and other motorists just don't know you're approaching or have little time to recognise you're about to filter past.

#### 151B Edge filtering past slow or stationary vehicles on a

#### motorbike

- (1) The rider of a motorbike is *edge filtering* along a length of road if the motorbike enters the edge of the road while the rider is passing 1 or more vehicles on the road.
- (2) The rider of a motorbike must not unlawfully edge filter along a length of road.

#### Maximum penalty—20 penalty units.

- (3) For subsection (2), if 1 or more of the following circumstances apply while a rider is edge filtering along a length of road, the rider is taken to have unlawfully edge filtered along the length of road—
- (a) the rider does not hold an O type licence for the class of the motorbike;
- (b) the speed limit for the length of road is less than 90km/h;
- (c) the rider rides at a speed of more than 30km/h;
- (d) the rider rides on any unsealed part of the road;
- (e) it is not safe to edge filter.

For filtering, it must be done between lanes of traffic travelling in the same direction. This means filtering between on coming and preceding lanes of traffic is not legal.



#### 151A Lane filtering between slow or stationary vehicles on a motorbike

- (1) The rider of a motorbike is *lane filtering* along a length of road if the rider rides the motorbike between—
- (a) two adjacent lines of traffic travelling in the same direction as the motorbike; or
- (b) two vehicles (regardless of whether the rider remains within a single marked lane), each vehicle travelling in—
- (i) the same direction as the motorbike; and
- (ii) separate, but adjacent, marked lanes.
- (2) The rider of a motorbike must not unlawfully lane filter along a length of road.
- (3) For subsection (2), if 1 or more of the following circumstances apply while a rider is lane filtering along a length of road, the rider is taken to have unlawfully lane filtered along the length of road—
- (a) the rider does not hold an O type licence for the class of the motorbike;
- (b) the rider rides at a speed of more than 30km/h;
- (c) the rider rides in a school zone;
- (d) it is not safe to lane filter.

You'll also notice that it isn't legal when it isn't safe to do so. So how do we know if it is safe to do so? Well, examples I've seen where riders have had to fold their mirrors out of the way, to squeeze through the narrowest of gaps suggests the gap wasn't there and you are not able to see behind you therefore you are not being safe. If another driver is forced to move their car out of the way to avoid getting their car damaged, then it isn't safe. Remember some car drivers are unaware of the approaching rider who is filtering through. The gap they left may have been their practice of buffering and may creep forward without realising you have committed to the gap.

As we approach the Christmas and New Year season we are faced with increased social activities and riding opportunities. I hope you all pause for a moment and think about the choices you have. Before you pass another rider, whether in regular traffic or out in the twisties, think about whether your riding behaviour behind them is placing yourself and that other rider at risk?






### **Christmas Party**


