

Shiny Side Up

Hello again everyone. I hope you have been enjoying this great Autumn weather in QLD's south east



region. Great days to be out enjoying your ride. Do you enjoy riding in a group? Have you ever experienced a crash or a heart jumping out of your mouth moment caused by another rider in your group?

I'm off to Cairns this week to deliver another Level 1 course for the Harley Owners Group and I am looking forward to the experience of riding around in Cairns again. Typical of social groups that ride together, there may be a formal or informal briefing, a general planning of the intended route or at the very least the identification of the end point and off you go. But there is also a lot of potential for that fun social ride to turn into a nasty and forgettable event.

I recall discussing a new rider's experience with his first group ride. There was a leader and a destination and off they went. What stopped him enjoying the ride was the behaviour of the other riders. Overtaking on corner entry, three abreast through curves on bobber and cruiser based bikes. This occurred on the highway and rural roads and some riders in the group were more interested in racing each other. This became a very big problem when the lead rider made a sudden left turn that everyone else was also expected to make. The speed and bunched up nature of the group caused mayhem as riders tried to make the turn or just avoid hitting slowing and turning bikes.

Another group ride I am aware of that ended in disaster arose because a rider crashed on a poor surfaced road with several riders also becoming involved by crashing into the crash. This does not sound like an enjoyable group ride to me. If you choose to blame the council, the road, the weather, Q-Ride, the other rider or driver then you'll keep crashing or having those near misses.

So, how do you turn your group ride into a completely enjoyable event? Give yourself time and space. Do not ever feel you need to keep up with a person riding faster than you're comfortably able to do and be confident to break out of the rigid dogma of formation riding. Something I discuss with riders I take on the road, after a section where the focus is on maintaining a 3 second gap is how the rider felt during that part of the ride. I hear them all comment on how relaxed the ride was. Their braking was less severe, there was more time to respond. They could see more and they enjoyed it more.

Riding too closely and in formation robs you of your ability to see and think. It artificially puts a box around your field of vision as you tend to just look one bike ahead and let the first rider do all the thinking for you. I say ride your own ride. By breaking out of the formation mindset, you are riding and thinking about what you are doing. This space you give yourself frees your mind and vision and you can maintain scanning through your 12, 6 and 3.

By keeping the 3 second follow distance you also take the pressure off the rider in front. This allows you to see the road surface and make good judgements and adjustments. You don't need a road captain to tell you what to do and point out a pot hole, you can see that for yourself using your 12, 6 and 3. There's no point seeing the pot hole being pointed at by a rider that is 1 second in front of you. All you'll be able to do is say "Oh Fffff". You won't even be able to finish the word as you've already hit it.

Think of a group ride where the lead rider needs to slow and take a turn that all of you must follow. If there is more space you get the time to see the upcoming turn, the lead rider's indicator and brake light and in turn your lights and the lead rider's lights are seen by all the other following riders.

I know there is pride and enjoyment at being part of a group of similar bikes all being out together, but when you think about it, travelling at 100km/h plus on the road with less than a second gap to the bike in front of you is a recipe for disaster. What's worse is I often see groups of riders occupying the outer edges of the lane, not the wheel track, and make no effort to move when passing oncoming traffic, even in curves. There is a reason why head on collisions rate as one of the five major crash types. Giving yourself more space lets you choose the best position on the road you need to be in at any given time.

Let's look at it this way, at 100km/h you are travelling at 27.7 metres each second, and it can take a person up to 1.5 to 3 seconds to respond to something they see. Let's say you take 2 seconds to respond to a sudden change made by the rider you're 1 second behind. At 100km/h you have just travelled 55.4 metres and you haven't even started braking yet.

I suggest that if you want to ride closely to each other, chase your mate through the curves and pass each other through the curves, do it safely by doing it in the fast group at a track day where not only is it permitted, it is expected.

I challenge you to try it. Go for a ride as a group and all agree to just ride your own ride and maintain a 3 second gap and if you want to experience some corner passing action and running at higher speeds book yourselves in for a track day.






