Shiny Side Up

Hello Link Readers,

My time with Stay Upright officially came to an end on 31st March and I am no longer their Senior Instructor for QLD. I was very encouraged by the support and feedback passed on to me by Gail, so I will continue writing for your magazine. There is more good news too as Tony, who was the QLD state manager for Stay Upright is commencing business as *Stay Safe Rider Training* and I am proud to announce we are delivering our first Road Craft course on Sunday 20th May.

This course will focus on riding and slow speed skills refresh with some personal coaching tailored to the individual as we circulate around the Mount Cotton Circuit. It is our plan to deliver a road focussed curriculum that will accommodate any rider who wants to improve, feel better, enjoy their ride more, refresh or update their knowledge and skills or simply wanting to stay safe on the road. I will look at delivering a more track focussed course in the future, but what I'm excited about is the chance to deliver courses that are more intimate and specific to what your needs are.

We can do half day and full day courses, focussing on slow speed, braking, cornering, and road craft. Tony and I are both Q-Ride Senior Instructors too and will cater for all you Preleaner and Licence courses.

So, if you are interested email Tony at <u>info@staysafeqride.com.au</u>. If you want to enjoy your cornering on the road or want the chance to practise the skills needed to get your braking or slow speed riding, email Tony. We can help nervous riders gain confidence and help make good riders better.

With that out of the way, I'd like to comment on a recent police operation targeting motorcyclists which caused a bit of a stir amongst the riding community. Some riders were not very happy with the attention aimed at motorcyclists. Statements being made on social media by riders debating whether or not it was revenue raising, or if the road toll for riders is actually increasing or decreasing. Whether you like it or not, a crash is a crash, and motorcyclists are more likely to get killed or permanently injured in a crash compared to someone crashing in a modern car.

What was very interesting to read were comments riders were making on social media like "Not my fault and nothing I could have done about it". I know it can seem like this sometimes but if we accept this then riding and not crashing is just dumb luck. That isn't good enough for me and it shouldn't be a lottery every time you ride. My philosophy is to make crashing not an option which starts with taking ownership of the things you can control so you can negotiate the things you cannot control. The easy thing to do is to tell yourself there was nothing you could have done but a careful analysis often reveals cues and clues that were missed, combined with an error of skill or lack of proficiency with stopping that resulted in a preventable crash.

The type of crashes happening now is not new and it is still the case that rider error is the leading crash type risk. Older riders are the ones at risk. So, to those riders that crashed and said it wasn't their fault, it many cases it was. I'm not talking legal fault, as in a breach of the rules, but a fault in your judgement and how you chose to respond to the hazard or situation and/or the time and space you gave yourself was not enough to avoid the crash.

Riders debate whether or not speed caused the crash, but the reality is when a rider fails to negotiate a bend and runs wide into oncoming traffic or hits an object, that crash is put down as speed being a causal factor to the crash because simply speaking, if you were a bit slower you would have been able to make the bend.

How do you avoid being one of those riders that fails to negotiate a bend? Ride sober, work on your vision ahead and what that information is telling you, refresh your skills in braking and cornering. Make a commitment to be better at the 1% skills like head checks every time you move off. A check of the mirror as you start to brake and another as you stop.

Enjoy your ride and Stay Safe!


The Last Wednesday of each month we have a general meeting at our club house. You are all welcome, members and visitors we would love to see you.




