#### MY BEST FRIEND IN THE CORNERS IS MY BACK BRAKE.

Hi Members just sharing some information that could be helpful to you about how to get yourself and your motorcycle smoothly thru corners you come upon on any of our local roads. Many years ago some riders who were much more experienced than myself explained and showed me this technique to use in corners.

For a start of course you need to use your front and back brakes of your motorcycle to wash off speed and approach the corner to get your line and start to go into and around the corner, all good! However what if the corner tightens up and you find you are travelling too fast for it to be taken at the speed you are travelling? Use of both brakes then will upset your line and affect the geometry of your motorcycles suspension. You can get thru that corner while using both brakes however by using your back brake only your bike shall stay on line and most importantly your bikes front suspension can remain unchanged and level while travelling thru and around that corner.

There are lots of forces in play on the front of a motorcycles suspension when passing thru a corner at speed and using the front brake on and off while travelling thru the corner upsets the motorcycles front suspension and makes the effort of getting around that corner harder on the rider. However once again of course if you have a lot of excess speed you need to lose you can and will use both front and back brakes to bring your speed down to a level where you can enter the corner.

Where the use of the back brake only works extremely well is when you are passing thru the corner and it tightens up on you or perhaps you have accelerated early to exit the corner either way you find your speed is too high to safely travel around and thru the corner. This scenario is where using just the back brake works very well is assisting you to get thru the corner at speed without upsetting the geometry of your bikes front suspension. Your throttle hand can remain firm and steady regulating the engine power to your bike without interruption by using the front brake lever.

Having your foot over the rear brake pedal and applying the brake to control your speed when necessary makes for much tighter travel thru the corner. You can trail the rear brake all the way thru the corners just varying the brake pressure a little as needed to reduce some speed if the corner demands it. When you get used to this technique you will find yourself powering on steady in and thru the corner and using the rear brake to control the speed without constantly adjusting the throttle and thereby raising and lowering the front of the motorcycles suspension.

Also a small slip or wheel lockup from using the back brake is much easier to handle in a corner then one from the front wheel. Try this in some low speed corners and when you are used to how it all works together you can use it when you are riding anywhere. We all have our ideas and habits for bike riding that we use so I hope that by sharing the above information it could be of some use to you. **RIDE SAFE FOREVER,** Harold.


